The Contract is changed as follows:

Due to more recent communications with Lead-Safe Ohio staff at the Ohio Department of Development Office of Community Enhancement (ODOD-OCE), this contract amendment revises Exhibit B language for the Lead Safe OH Administrative Contract as follows:

>This Contract Amendment Revises Exhibit B language to reflect ODOD-OCE requirements for allowable "Soft Costs" and "General Administration" dollars that may be charged to the Lead Safe OH Grant (2023-202339) for individual housing projects/units. For projects closed/undertaken, ODOD-OCE now allows "Soft Costs" of only 20% of total project hard/construction costs with an additional allowance of only 10% for "General Administration." The 20% (soft cost) and 10% (administrative) allowances are based on the project's construction/bid total ("Hard Costs"), including any necessary change orders. This is a change from the allowable LSO project costs understood when the contract was initially executed. Note: Kleinfelder has been following these allowances for individual LSO projects/units since beginning work on LSO projects. This contract amendment corrects initial contract language to reflect what is/has been allowed by ODOD-OCE and charged/invoiced for project soft costs and general administration.

Note Key Revisions:

- >No change to original contract amount of \$128,800; Kleinfelder understands that the overall contract amount may be adjusted/decreased based on the number of projects/units closed and those inspected but not closed/undertaken.
- >Removes Kleinfelder's minimum "per unit soft cost" estimates of \$12,500 for residential units and \$16,000 for childcare facilities.
- >Revises Kleinfelder's initial Lump Sum Compensation per unit (removing "greater of" and removing minimum \$12,500/\$16,000) to be ODOD-OCE's allowable 20% of project "hard/construction costs" for residential and childcare units with an additional 10% of project hard costs allowed for General Administration (for projects closed/undertaken).
- >As needed, when individual projects/units require execution of change orders in any amount after initial project approval, Kleinfelder will include the ODOD-OCE allowable 20% for soft costs and 10% for general administration (based on project's total "hard/construction" costs), accordingly. The \$5,000 change order total is removed.
- >The 10% administrative allowances (based on projects' total costs) will be invoiced L/S when projects are completed (for those projects closed).

- WHEREAS, the Board of Auglaize County Commissioners has determined that it shall continue efforts to enhance, foster, aid, provide and promote economic development activities within its geographic area; and,
- **WHEREAS**, in lieu of creating a port authority, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 9.482 and 4582.431, the Board of Auglaize County Commissioners is possessed of the power to enter into an agreement with an existing port authority; and,

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

This Cooperative Agreement (the "Cooperative Agreement") dated as of December _____, 2024, is entered into by and between Auglaize County, Ohio, a political subdivision of the State of Ohio, by and through its Board of County Commissioners (the "County") and the Erie County Port Authority, a body corporate and politic duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Ohio (together with its permitted successors and assigns, the "Authority"), under the circumstances described below.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the County has determined that it shall continue to enhance, foster, aid, provide and promote commerce and economic development within its geographic area by providing assistance to one or more projects, and that such projects shall create and preserve jobs and employment opportunities within the same (hereinafter referred to as the "Projects");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 4582.22, the County is possessed of the power to create a port authority which shall possess all of the powers enumerated in Ohio Revised Code Section 4582.21 *et seq.*;

WHEREAS, the Authority is possessed of broad powers relating to economic development and the creation and preservation of jobs and employment opportunities, including those granted pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 4582.21 *et seq.*;

WHEREAS, in lieu of creating a port authority, the County has requested that the Authority assist it with certain Projects within its geographic area in accordance with the terms of this Cooperative Agreement;

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Sections 9.482 and 4582.431 authorize the County to enter into an agreement with the Authority under which the County authorizes the Authority to exercise any power, perform any function, or render any service on behalf of the County, which the County is authorized to exercise, perform or render;

WHEREAS, the locations of the Projects are outside the geographic area in which the Authority is otherwise authorized to exercise its powers, and in order to assist the County with the Projects, the Authority must obtain the County's authorization to exercise powers possessed by the County for such purposes;

WHEREAS, the County possesses legal authority to and the County is willing to authorize the Authority to exercise within the County, with respect to certain Projects, such legal authority as the County possesses; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined that the Projects are in furtherance of the Authority's authorized purposes and the Authority is willing to assist the County with the Projects as requested from time to time.

- NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual agreements and covenants contained herein, and receipt of other good and valuable consideration, the County and the Authority hereby agree as follows:
- Section 1. The County does hereby authorize the Authority to exercise such powers as the County possesses to conduct certain Projects within the territorial jurisdiction of the County according to the terms of this Cooperative Agreement; provided that, the County does not make any representation as to the extent of its legal power or authority or the required manner of their exercise under Ohio law.
- Section 2. Upon invitation by the County to participate on a project, the Authority agrees to provide such services relating to the Projects on such terms as are further agreed upon between the parties hereto.
- Section 3. The Authority agrees to provide the Auglaize County Community Improvement Corporation (the "CIC") with a portion of the Authority's transaction fee, in an amount agreed upon by the Authority and the CIC with respect to each of the Projects.
- <u>Section 4</u>. The County shall have no financial liability whatsoever regarding the structuring, acquisition, financing, construction and development of any Project contemplated under this Cooperative Agreement unless otherwise agreed to in any subsequent written agreement.
- <u>Section 5.</u> This Cooperative Agreement shall in all respects be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio, without reference to principles of conflicts of laws.
- Section 6. This Cooperative Agreement shall be non-exclusive and shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of County and the Authority and their respective successors and permitted assigns. No party may assign this Cooperative Agreement or any of its rights or obligations hereunder in whole or in part without the prior written consent of each of the other parties hereto.
- Section 7. This Cooperative Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts as may be convenient or necessary and it shall not be necessary that the signatures of all of the parties hereto be contained on any one counterpart. Additionally, the parties hereto agree that for purposes of facilitating the execution of this Cooperative Agreement, (a) the signature pages taken from the separate individually executed counterparts of this Cooperative Agreement may be combined to form multiple fully executed counterparts and (b) a facsimile transmission shall be deemed to be an original signature for all purposes. All executed counterparts of this Cooperative Agreement shall be deemed to be originals, but all such counterparts taken individually or collectively, as the case may be, shall constitute one and the same agreement.
- Section 8. This Cooperative Agreement may be terminated by the parties hereto upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party; provided, that if a financing or other formal transaction commitment has been issued for a Project, and the consummation of the Project in

accordance with the financing or other formal transaction commitment requires the participation of the Authority, then this Cooperative Agreement shall not be subject to termination as to such Project until such Project is either complete or has been determined by the parties hereto to be incapable of completion.
