IN THE MATTER OF AUTHORIZING A CHANGE ORDER #1 AND #2 FOR HOUSING REHABILITATION FOR LINDA DODSON UNDER THE C.H.I.P. PROGRAM.

The Board of County Commissioners of Auglaize County, Ohio, met in regular session on the 11th day of October, 2012.

Commissioner Spencer moved the adoption of the following:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners did receive a grant through the State of Ohio's Comprehensive Housing Improvement Program for the rehabilitation of housing units within the County; and,

WHEREAS, in Resolution #12-240, dated June 7, 2012, the Board approved rehabilitation to the property of Linda Dodson at a cost of \$26,921.00; and,

WHEREAS, Poggemeyer Design Group Inc. has advised the Board of the need for a change order #1 \$1,432.00 and change order #2 in the amount of \$3,363.00; said change orders are the installation of driveway approach due to tripping hazard; new drain line & connect to City of St. Marys storm sewer system; frosted glass in 2 windows; and install light & switch in attic and installation of balance of driveway due to tripping hazard and full screens on windows; and,

WHEREAS, this change order will alter the new cost to \$31,716.00.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of County Commissioners does hereby authorize the above noted change orders for housing rehabilitation work for the Linda Dodson property.

IN THE MATTER OF SIGNING A RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT AND PROTECT COAL AS A SOURCE FOR U.S. ELECTRICITY GENERATION.

The Board of County Commissioners of Auglaize County, Ohio met in regular session on the 11th day of October, 2012.

Commissioner Spencer moved the adoption of the following

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, coal is fundamental to how our nation produces electricity and approximately 46 percent of U.S. electricity is derived from coal base load power plants. Coal is also by far the nation's most abundant source of energy, constituting 94 percent of the nation's fossil fuel resources. The United States has nearly 261 billion tons of recoverable coal reserves, according to the Energy Information Administration, which is a 249-year supply at current rates of use; and,

WHEREAS, the correlation between coal-fueled electricity and economic growth is near-perfect. For example, states that rely predominantly on coal generation are generally the states with the lowest electricity rates. Twenty of the twenty-five states with the lowest electricity costs rely upon coal generation for at least 40 percent of their electricity generation - and all have rates below the national average. It is no coincidence that these states also have the highest concentrations of manufacturing; and,

WHEREAS, some lawmakers and politicians at the Environmental Protection Agency are over-reaching in their attempts to limit the use of coal for electricity generation. When they try to stop us from using coal, they attack the very foundations of our nation; and,

WHEREAS, but it doesn't have to happen. Not if we stand up for keeping our electricity rates low and demand that we take advantage of our most abundant power-generating resource; and,

WHEREAS, coal was the answer generations ago as we built this nation. It's the answer today as we struggle to restore and renew our economy and make the lives of our people better once again. And, it's the answer for generations yet to come.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Commissioners of Auglaize County, Ohio does hereby petition our elected officials to pursue new policies and stop the costly and harmful pursuit of regulations and policies that threaten the benefits provided by coal-based electricity generation.
